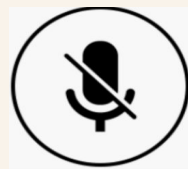

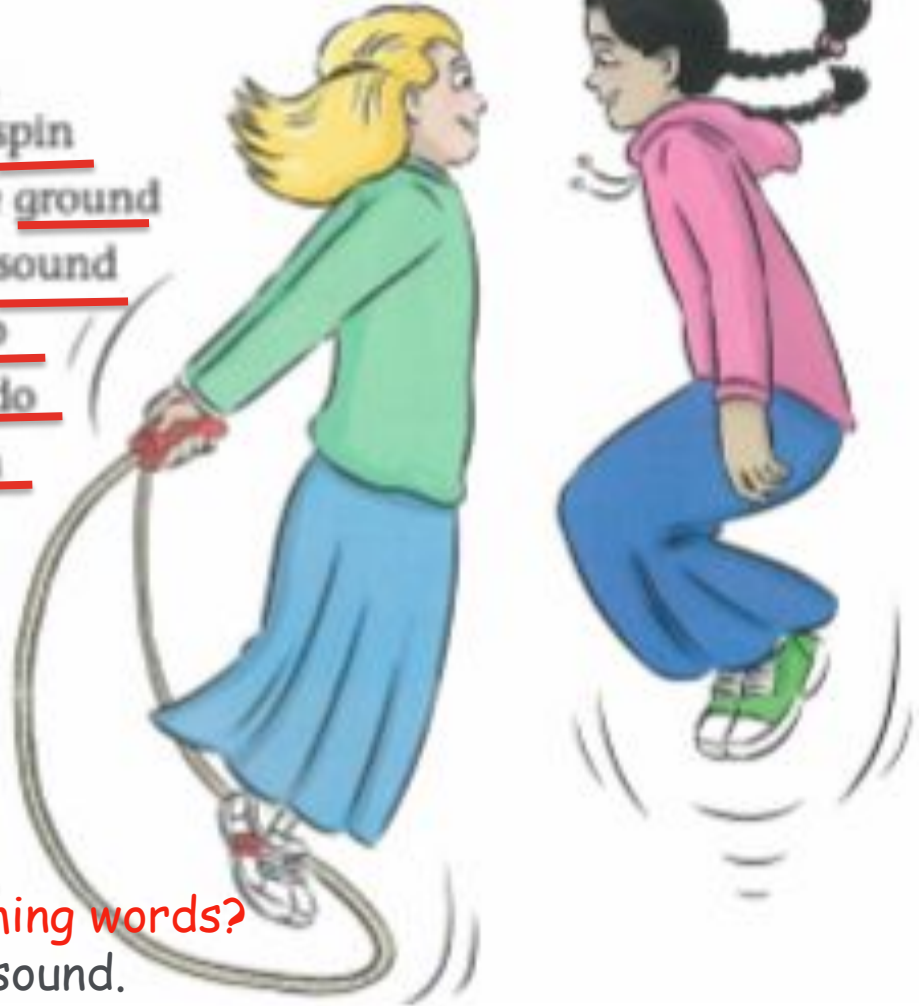
What the video! Rhyme time

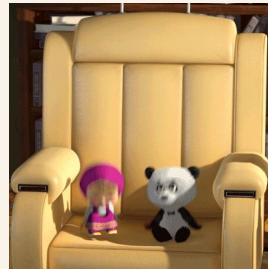

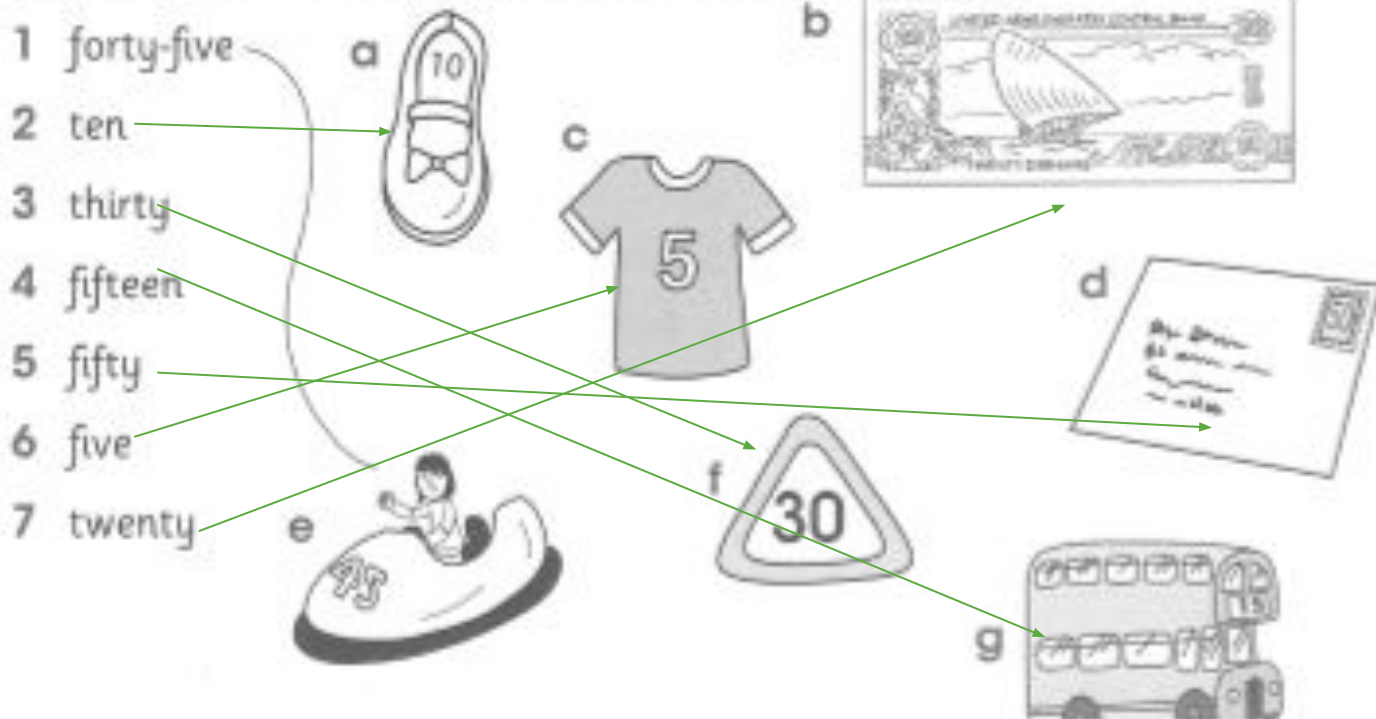
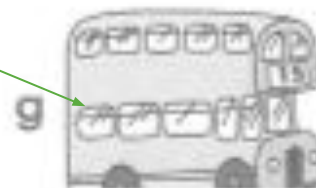
